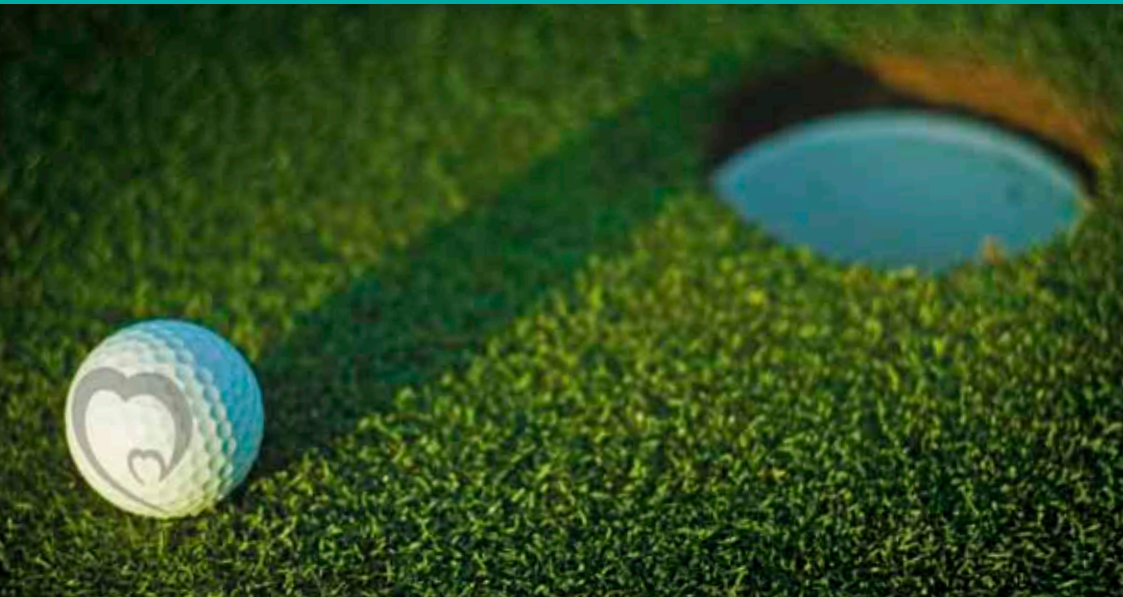

ABOUT US

Miracle Babies Foundation is Australia's leading organisation that supports premature and sick newborns, their families and the hospitals that care for them.

Every year in Australia around 44,000 newborn babies require the help of a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) or Special Care Nursery (SCN). 25,000 of these babies are born premature and up to 1,000 babies lose their fight for life.

The birth of a premature or sick newborn can be an overwhelming and traumatic experience for families. Their lives are permanently changed, significantly influenced by their NICU experience.

Miracle Babies Foundation is dedicated to positively supporting this experience through our NurtureProgram, online resource centre, hospital support and community awareness.

FINNIGAN CHARLES O'CONNOR

Finnigan Charles O'Connor, and his younger fraternal twin brother, Lachlan James Finnigan were born on the 21st December 2009 weighing 650 and 750 grams respectively.

They were born at 23 weeks and four days. Although this is only the start to Lachlan's journey, unfortunately this was soon to be the end for Finnigan's journey in this world. They were both rushed to the NICU of King Edward Memorial Hospital and both ventilated. All seemed to be fine despite their prematurity. Until we received a phone call in the early morning of the 23rd December and were told that Finnigan was not responding well and his lungs were shutting down. He had to be put on a stronger ventilator, which was doing all his breathing for him but at the same time damaging his lungs.

We sat by his bedside praying and hoping he would pull through, but were told that he would not survive. He passed away in our arms, beside his brother's cot at 12pm on the 23rd December. His brother remained a further 130 days in hospital and we had the heart breaking task of taking him home and beginning our life as a family without his brother. Although Finnigan's story is short his memory and our love for him will last a life time, like so many other precious babies who will not get to grow up.
